HOW TO DISCOVER THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF AN "ACTED PARABLE"

The "<u>stories</u>" we read in the Bible, whether in the Old or New Testament, we tend to think are only put there for our interest or perhaps to draw a good moral lesson. Both of those thoughts are good and true but there is <u>another reason</u> for their being put there and that is the <u>most interesting of all</u> !

The Apostle Paul tells us the reason :

1 Cor 10 : 1, 5, 11 "Moreover, brethren, I would not that ye should be ignorant, how that all our fathers were under the cloud, and all passed through the sea ; but with many of them God was not well pleased : for they were overthrown in the wilderness. Now <u>all these</u> <u>things happened unto them</u> for **ensamples** and they are <u>written for</u> <u>our admonition</u>, upon whom <u>the ends of the world are come</u>.

Thus, the "<u>stories</u>" of things that happened long ago to the people of God are <u>models or ensamples</u> or **Acted Parables** of <u>things to be</u> <u>repeated</u> again <u>during the last days</u> of earths history !

Strong's Concordance gives the meaning for **ensample** from the Greek as :

- # 5179 tupos (from # 5180 tupto) a <u>model</u> for warning, a type, a figure
- # 5180 tupto <u>repeated</u> blows

The <u>Spirit of Prophecy</u> has this to say :

"In the days of Jeremiah, the Lord taught the people by means of a series of A<u>cted Parables</u>". Prophets and Kings (page 423).

"He taught spiritual lessons in every miracle performed... the cursing of the fig tree was an <u>Acted Parable</u>".

Desire of Ages pages 266, 267, 336, 341, 582.

Thus in <u>both</u> **Old** and **New Testaments** there are "<u>Acted Parables</u>" for us to learn from.
