<u>Bible Facts</u> Concerning The <u>Gift Of Prophecy</u>

1. **<u>Prophets</u>** are the <u>means of **communication**</u> between God and man

- (**Heb. 1: 1**) "God...spake unto the fathers by the prophets..."
- (I Cor. 14: 3) "...He that prophesieth unto men to edification, exhortation, and comfort."
- (Num. 12: 6) "...If there be a prophet among you I the Lord will make myself known unto him In a vision and...in a dream."
- 2. <u>Prophecy</u> is <u>one</u> of the <u>gifts</u> of the Holy Spirit

(Eph. 4: 8,11,12) "...When He ascended up on high, He...gave gifts unto men." "and He gave...Apostles... <u>Prophets</u>... Evangelists... Pastors... and Teachers... for the edifying of the body of Christ."

3. <u>All</u> the <u>gifts</u> are <u>to remain</u> in the Church <u>until 2nd coming</u>. (Jesus)
(I Cor.1:6,7) "Even as the <u>testimony of Christ</u> was confirmed in you so that <u>ye come behind</u> in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

4. The <u>Gift of **Prophecy**</u> is a <u>special sign</u> of those that <u>believe</u> <u>the truth</u>.

(I Cor. 14: 22) "Wherefore <u>tongues</u> are for a <u>sign</u>...to them that <u>believe not</u>; but <u>prophesying</u> ...for them <u>which <u>believe</u>."</u>

- 5. <u>Prophets</u> are the "Eyes" of the Church.
- (Isa. 29: 10) "...The Lord...hath closed your eyes; the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath he covered."
- (I Sam. 9: 9) "...He that is now called a <u>prophet</u> was beforetime called a <u>seer</u>".

6. The <u>Gift of **Prophecy**</u> helps us to <u>identify</u> Gods <u>true</u> <u>Church</u>

- (**Rev. 12: 17**) "...The <u>remnant</u> of her seed which keep the Commandments of God and have the Testimony of Jesus."
- (**Rev. 19: 10**) "...For the <u>Testimony of Jesus</u> is the <u>Spirit of Prophecy</u>."

7. The <u>Gift of **Prophecy**</u> and <u>keeping</u> <u>**God's Law**</u> will always <u>be</u> <u>together</u>.

- (Lam. 2: 9) "...The <u>Law</u> is <u>no more</u>: Her <u>prophets</u> also find <u>no vision</u> from the Lord."
- (**Prov. 29: 18**) "Where there is no vision the people perish: But he that keepeth the Law, happy is he."

8. <u>Prophets</u> can be <u>men</u> or <u>women</u>

- (Ex. 15: 20) "And <u>Miriam</u> the <u>prophetess</u>, the sister of Aaron..."
- (Judges 4: 4) "And <u>Deborah</u>, a <u>prophetess</u>...<u>she</u> judged Israel at that time."

(II Kings 20: 1) "...And the prophet <u>Isaiah</u> the son Amoz."

9. <u>Prophets</u> are to be <u>tested</u> by the <u>Bible</u>

(Isa. 8: 20) "To the <u>Law</u> and to the <u>Testimony</u>: If they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

- (I John 4: 1) "...Believe not every spirit, but <u>try</u> the <u>spirits</u> whether they are of God."
- (I Cor. 14: 32) "And the <u>spirits</u> of <u>the prophets</u> are <u>subject</u> to <u>the prophets</u>."
- 10. The **<u>Bible Tests</u>** of a <u>true prophet</u>

Test 1. "Every spirit that confesses that <u>Jesus</u> (**I John 4: 2**) <u>Christ</u> is <u>come in the flesh</u> is of God."

Test 2. "To the **Law** and to the **Testimony** if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

Test 3. "When <u>the word</u> of the prophet shall <u>come</u> (Jere. 28: 9) <u>to pass</u>, then shall the prophet be known, that the Lord hath truly sent him."

Test 4. "W	/herefore by their fruits ye shall
(Matt. 7: 20)	know them."
Test 5.	"O my Lord, by the visionI have
(Dan. 10: 16,17)	retained no strength."There
	remaineth no strength in me, <u>neither</u>
	is there breath left in me."
(Num. 24: 4)	"He hath said, which heard the words
	of God, which saw the vision of the
	Almighty, <u>falling into a trance</u> , but
	having his eyes open."

11. The <u>Gift of **Prophecy**</u> will cause God's people to **prosper**.

(IIChron.20: 20) "...Believe in the Lord your God, so shall ye be established; Believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper."

12. The Gift of Prophecy will preserve God's people.

(Hosea 12: 13) "And by a prophet the Lord brought Israel out of Egypt, and <u>by a **prophet**</u> was he **preserved**.

13. The <u>Gift of **Prophecy**</u> is <u>not</u> to be <u>despised</u>.

(I Thess. 5: 19,20) "Quench <u>not the Spirit</u>. <u>Despise not prophesyings</u>."

14. If we <u>reject</u> the <u>Gift of</u> <u>Prophecy</u> the Lord will <u>require it</u> <u>of us</u>.

(Deut. 18: 18,19)

"I will raise them up <u>a **prophet**</u> from among their brethren...And he shall speak unto them all that I command him. And it shall come to pass, that <u>whosoever will not hearken</u> unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require it of him."

Why does the <u>Gift of Prophets</u> and <u>Prophecy</u> <u>disappear</u> from God's people?

Proverbs 29: 18

18 Where there is <u>no vision</u>, the <u>people perish</u>: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he.

Ezekiel 7: 26

26 Mischief shall come upon mischief, and rumour shall be upon rumour; then shall <u>they seek a</u> <u>vision</u> of the prophet: but the <u>law shall perish</u> from the priest, and counsel from the ancients.

Lamentations 2:9

9 Her gates are sunk into the ground: he hath destroyed and broken her bars: her king and her princes are among the Gentiles: The <u>law is no more</u>; her prophets also find <u>no vision</u> from the Lord.

When God's <u>people</u> <u>refuse</u> to keep His <u>Law</u> (10 Commandments), <u>God</u> <u>refuses</u> to give them the <u>Gift of Prophecy</u> and <u>a</u> <u>Prophet</u>!

Revelation 12: 17


17 And the dragon was wroth with the woman and went to make war with the <u>Remnant</u> of her seed, which <u>keep the</u> <u>Commandments</u> of God, and <u>have the testimony of Jesus</u> <u>Christ.</u>

Revelation 19: 10

10 And I fell at his feet to worship him. And he said unto me, See thou do it not: I am thy fellow servant, and of <u>thy</u> <u>brethren that **have the testimony of Jesus**</u>: worship God: for <u>the **testimony of Jesus is the Spirit of Prophecy**</u>.


Conclusion:

Now we see **why** God's <u>true Church has</u> the <u>Gift of</u> <u>Prophecy</u>! Because it <u>keeps God's Law</u> (10 Commandments)!



Israel did **not expect** there would be <u>anymore prophets</u> after the **O.T**. **was closed**, yet there **were!** (John 8: 52,53)

(Mal. 4: 1-5)



Today, <u>Christians do not expect</u> that there will be <u>anymore</u> prophets after the <u>N.T.</u> <u>has been closed</u>, but the Bible says there <u>will be</u>!! (Mal. 4: 1-5)

What will be the **message** of the **True Prophet**?

Malachi 3

1 Behold, I will send <u>my **messenger**</u>, and he shall **prepare** <u>the way before me</u>: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the <u>messenger</u> of the <u>covenant</u>, whom ye delight in: behold, <u>he shall come</u>, saith the Lord of hosts.

2 But who may abide the day of his coming?

Malachi 4

5 Behold, I will send you <u>Elijah</u> the <u>prophet</u> before the coming of the great and dreadful <u>day of the Lord</u>: 4 <u>Remember</u> ye the <u>law</u> of Moses my servant, which I commanded unto him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments.

Malachi 2

8 But ye are departed out of the way; ye have caused many to stumble at the <u>law</u>; ye have corrupted the <u>covenant</u> of Levi, saith the Lord of hosts.

9 Therefore have I also made you contemptible and base before all the people, according as ye have been <u>partial</u> in the <u>law</u>.

15 And I will come near to you to judgment;...

Conclusions: The "Elijah" Message

- 1. A message which will <u>prepare</u> the people for the 2^{nd} coming of Jesus.
- 2. A message which will <u>turn</u> the people <u>back</u> to the <u>Law or</u> <u>Covenant</u> of God.
- 3. A message of <u>Judgment</u>.

Will "<u>Elijah</u>" <u>himself</u> <u>come back</u> before <u>Jesus comes</u> <u>the 2nd time</u>?

Facts:

- 1. Elijah was taken to heaven II Kings 2: 1,11
- The Jews asked <u>John the Baptist</u> if <u>he</u> was Elijah and John said he <u>was</u> <u>not</u> <u>Elijah</u>. John 1: 19-23
- 3. <u>Jesus</u> said <u>John</u> <u>was</u> <u>Elijah</u>. Matt. 17: 10-13

<u>Either</u>:

John or Jesus were lying

or

They were both telling the truth.

Comment:


If <u>either</u> <u>were lying</u>, we might as well pack up and forget the Bible and go home! If they were both telling the truth, then John was <u>not really Elijah</u> but he <u>did</u> have the "<u>Elijah</u>" <u>Message</u>! Luke 1: 13-17

<u>Similarly</u>, we can then expect "<u>Elijah</u>" to <u>reappear</u> before the <u>2nd coming of Christ</u>, <u>not</u> as the <u>real Elijah</u>, but as a <u>prophet</u> with the "<u>Elijah</u>" <u>Message</u>!! Malachi 4: 1-6

When will the <u>True Prophet</u> appear?

Facts: Regarding all time prophecies

- 1. They <u>all</u> have to do with <u>Judgment</u>
- 2. There are <u>always</u> at least **<u>2 prophets</u>** for <u>each</u> time prophecy.
 - A. First prophet <u>gives</u> the prophecy.
 - B. Second prophet arises at the <u>end time</u> of the prophecy, warns the people, and gets them ready.
- 3. There is <u>always</u> a <u>remnant</u> that <u>believes</u> the message of the prophet.
- 4. There are <u>always false prophets</u> who <u>arise at the end time</u> of the prophecy to deceive.



1. The <u>Mormon</u> group was started by <u>their</u> "<u>prophet</u>" <u>Joseph</u> <u>Smith</u> (1805-1844), who claimed that he received direct communication from God. Some of the "visions" Smith claimed to have received between

1820-1844 led to such practices as baptism for the dead and multiple wives. His life was cut short in 1844 when he was murdered by a mob while awaiting trial.

2. The <u>Shakers</u> reached their peak of influence in 1830 but continued for several decades. <u>Their</u> "<u>prophet</u>" was <u>Ann Lee</u> who claimed to be Christ Himself incarnate in woman's flesh.

3. <u>Starkweather and Gorgas</u> were responsible for "spiritual manifestations" that caused many people to lose all confidence in visions or prophets in 1843.

4. <u>Baha'u'llah</u> claimed to be the "messenger of God". He declared his mission in Iran in 1844. He claimed to be <u>the promised one</u> of all religions. Baha'u'llah is the "<u>prophet</u>" of the <u>Baha'i faith</u>.

5.<u>Ellen G. (Harmon) White</u> was a young girl who received her <u>first</u> "<u>vision</u>" at the age of 17 in December, 1844. A serious injury caused her to leave school after the third grade. The remarkable "visions" she received during her lifetime have proven to be completely

reliable. With her limited education, her knowledge in a wide variety of fields was far ahead of her time and could have come only from God. She became involved in the world wide Second Advent Movement of the

1840's and later became instrumental in helping to found what was to become the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

The Bible <u>Tests</u> of a <u>Prophet</u> Applied to <u>Ellen G. White</u>

<u>Test # I</u>

I John 4: 2 "Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God."....

What did Ellen White believe about Jesus? Here are a few samples:

Desire of Ages, p. 19.

"We are believers in Christ,...in His divinity and in His pre-existence." 6 T 58.

Ellen White believed in Christ, in His virgin birth, in His death for mankind. She taught that we are saved by the blood of Jesus, and thus easily passes this important test.

<u>Test # 2</u>

Isaiah 8: 20

"To the <u>law</u> and to the <u>testimony</u>: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

In the book <u>*The Great Controversy*</u>, Ellen White said: "The Holy Scriptures are to be accepted as an authoritative, infallible revelation of His will. They are the standards of character, the revealer of doctrines, and the test of experience." (Introduction to GC, p. vii.)

Ellen White believed in the Bible. Her writings are in perfect accord with God's Holy Word. In fact, here is how she viewed her writings in relation to the Bible:

"...The Lord has given a lesser light." (*Colporteur Evangelist*, p. 37).

Ellen White saw her writings as a "lesser light" to lead men and women to the "greater light," which is the Bible. The Holy Scriptures have been ignored by millions; but Ellen White's writings are dedicated to helping those millions discover or rediscover God's Word. Every sentence she wrote is in perfect harmony with the Bible. On this basis, the writings of Mrs. White pass the test of Isaiah 8: 20.

<u>Test # 3</u>

Jeremiah 28: 9 "When the word of the prophet shall <u>come to</u> <u>pass</u>, then shall the prophet be known, that the Lord hath truly sent him."

Have Ellen White's predictions come to pass?

This is a fundamental test in ascertaining the validity of a prophet, and one which Mrs. White must pass. Let's find out.

TOBACCO

In the year 1864, Ellen White wrote:

"Tobacco is a poison of the most deceitful and malignant kind, having an exciting, then a paralyzing influence upon the nerves of the body. It is all the more dangerous because its effects upon the system are so slow, and at first scarcely perceivable. Multitudes have fallen victims to its poisonous influence. They have surely murdered themselves by this slow poison," *Temperance*, p. 57. That was over 100 years ago! The world laughed at her, but today it no longer laughs. This unusual prediction, made at a time when smoking was considered harmless, proves that Ellen White was far ahead of her time. And no wonder—God, who knows all secrets, knew that smoking was dangerous, and sent word through His humble messenger that mankind should not smoke.

DISASTER

In the book *Evangelism*, pages 403, 404, Ellen White made this prediction:

"Not long hence these cities will suffer under the judgment of God. San Francisco and Oakland are becoming as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the Lord will visit them in wrath."

Quite a statement! Yet many believed her message and moved from the two cities specifically mentioned as the targets of God's wrath, Her prediction was penned in 1902: on April 18, 1906, San Francisco was largely destroyed by an earthquake. Fire followed in the wake of the earthquake, and Oakland and other nearby cities suffered greatly.

ANARCHY

In 1903, a book written by Mrs. White made a startling prediction:

"At the same time <u>anarchy</u> is seeking to sweep away all law, not only divine, but human. <u>The centralizing of</u> <u>wealth and power; the vast combinations for the enriching</u> <u>of the few</u> at the expense of many; <u>the combinations of the</u> <u>poorer classes</u> <u>for the defense of their interest and claims</u>; the spirit of unrest, of riot and bloodshed; the world-wide

dissemination of the same teachings that led to the French Revolution,--all are tending to involve the whole world in a struggle similar to that which convulsed France." *Education*, p. 228

CANCER A VIRUS

Ellen White made a daring statement in the year 1905.

Here it is:

"People are continually eating flesh that is filled with tuberculosis and cancerous germs. Tuberculosis, cancer, and other fatal disease are thus communicated." (*Ministry of Healing*, p. 313).

Two factors stand out in the above statement: first, that cancer is caused by a virus or germ; and secondly, that it is infectious, or can be transmitted from one body to another.

This new concept strongly contradicted the thinking of scientists of 1905 who maintained that cancer was not caused by a virus or germ, and denied that cancer was infectious. However, the June 18, 1956, issue of *Newsweek* declared:

"In Detroit last week, at a meeting of the third National Cancer Conference, Dr. Wendell Stanley, University of California virologist and Nobel Prize Winner, went so far as to state without qualification that he believes 'viruses cause most or all human cancers'...".

He further declared that a virus is a "miniature germ." *The New York Times* of September 29, 1960, gave this account:

"A virus has been linked with eight human cancers in findings to be reported today by scientists at the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research."

Next, the National Institute of Health, located at Bethesda, Maryland, "There isn't the slightest doubt in our minds that human cancers are caused by viruses. To this extent, they are simply infectious diseases." *Newsweek*, March 27, 1961.

These statements show conclusively that Ellen White was far ahead of her time. How did she know this? There could be only one answer—because God showed her, so He could communicate this to humanity. Ten full years before Edison invented the incandescent lamp, Ellen G. White wrote of the electric currents in the brain and nervous system. Her statement was first published in 1869 in a pamphlet, later included in volume 2 of the *Testimonies*:

"Whatever disturbs the electrical currents in the nervous system lessens the strength of the vital powers, and the result is a deadening of the sensibilities of the mind." *Testimonies*, vol. 2, p. 347.

Three years later she referred to "the electrical force of the brain" as a factor in the resistance of disease.(*Testimonies*,vol.3, p. 157) See also *Education*, pages 197 and 209.

When Ellen White wrote thus nearly a century ago, little was known of physiology and still less of the properties of electricity. The idea of electrical currents in the body was quite foreign to the thinking of physicians. It was not until 1929 —fourteen years after Ellen White laid down her facile pen, and sixty years after she had made her initial statement concerning "electrical currents in the nervous system," – that scientific work in this field was made public; and another decade or so before it was taken seriously. For the record, we quote briefly from an article by W. Grey Walter:

"Twenty-five years ago Hans Berger, a German psychiatrist working in Jena, began to publish some strange little pictures consisting of nothing but wavy lines. They should have caused great excitement among his colleagues, because he claimed that they showed the electrical activity of the human brain. But in fact no one took them seriously. For several years no one even bothered to repeat his experiments."

In the quarter of a century since then the study of his little wavy lines has grown into a new department of science called "electroencephalography." Today several hundred laboratories in the United States and a similar number in Europe are recording and interpreting charts of the electrical discharges of human brains. Their total annual output of charts would girdle the earth. Hospitals all over the world have accumulated thousands upon thousands of brainprints, --*Scientific American*, June, 1954, p. 54.

Rapid Increase in Disasters in the Natural World

In words penned and first published in 1884, and included in the 1888 edition of *Great Controversy*, Mrs. White forecast a rapid increase in calamities in the natural world, and explained why this will be:

In accidents and calamities by sea and by land, in great conflagrations, in fierce tornadoes and terrific hail-storms, in tempests, floods, cyclones, tidal waves, and earthquakes, in every place and in a thousand forms, Satan is exercising his power. He sweeps away the ripening harvest, and famine and distress follow. He imparts to the air a deadly taint, and thousands perish by the pestilence. These visitations are to become more and more frequent and disastrous. — *Great Controversy*, pp. 589,590.

Another forecast was made in testimonies published in 1900:

The restraining Spirit of God is even now being withdrawn from the world. Hurricanes, storms, tempests, fire and flood, disasters by sea and land, follow each other in quick succession. Science seeks to explain all these. The signs thickening around us, telling of the near approach of the Son of God, are attributed to any other than the true cause. Men cannot discern the sentinel angels restraining the four winds that they shall not blow until the servants of God are sealed; but when God shall bid His angels loose the winds, there will be a scene of strife as no pen can picture. – *Testimonies*, vol. 6, p. 408.

Scenes of Commotion in the Economic World

There are not many, even among educators and statesmen, who comprehend the causes that underlie the present state of society. Those who hold the reins of government are not able to solve the problem of moral corruption, poverty, pauperism, and increasing crime. *They are struggling in vain to place business operations on a more secure basis.* If men would give more heed to the teachings of God's Word, they would find a solution of the problems that perplex them. – *Testimonies*, vol. 9, p. 13. Italics supplied.

Developments We May Expect in Religion Hands across the gulf

...When Protestantism shall stretch her hand across the gulf to grasp the hand of the Roman power, when she shall reach over the abyss to clasp hands with Spiritualism, when, under the influence of this threefold union, *our country shall repudiate every principle of its constitution as a Protestant and republican government*, and shall make provision for the propagation of papal falsehoods and delusions, then we may know that the time has come for the marvelous working of Satan, and that the end is near. -- *Testimonies*, vol. 5 (1885), p.451.

Sunday laws

In the movements now in progress in the United States to secure for the institutions and usages of the church the support of the state, Protestants are following in the steps of papists. Nay, more, they are opening the door for the papacy to regain in Protestant America the supremacy which she has lost in the Old World. And that which gives greater significance to this movement is the fact that the principle object contemplated is the enforcement of Sunday observance, -- a custom which originated with Rome, and which she claims as the sign of her authority. It is the spirit of the papacy, -- the spirit of conformity to worldly customs, the veneration for human traditions above the commandments of God, -- that is permeating the Protestant churches, and leading them on to do the same work of Sunday exaltation which the papacy has done before them. - Great Controversy, p. 573. Italics supplied.

<u>Test # 4</u>

Matthew 7:20

"Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them."

What was Ellen White like? Did she have a burden for souls? Was anyone led to Christ through her?

Here's what one writer said about Mrs. White, just twelve months before her death:

"This remarkable woman, though almost entirely self-educated, <u>has written</u> and <u>published more books</u> and in more languages, which circulate to a greater extent <u>than the</u> written works of <u>any woman in history</u>," <u>George Wharton</u> Jones in <u>California-Romantic</u> <u>and Beautiful</u>, p. 320.

This statement becomes even more remarkable when we consider that Ellen White had only a third grade education!

At the close of Ellen White's long life, a newspaper writer editorialized:

"Her death marks the calling of another noted leader of religious thought and one whose almost ninety years were full to overflowing with **good deeds**, **kind words**, and **earnest prayers** for all mankind." <u>Saint Helena, California Star</u>, July 23, 1915.

The editor of a leading religious journal commented, upon her death:

<u>Ellen White's life was spent</u> in writing, counseling, and <u>guiding men and women to the Saviour</u>. When she died, many people spontaneously gave their testimony concerning the faithfulness of her life.

The following statements relate to an examination made while Mrs. White was in vision in Waldron's Hall, Hillsdale, Mich., in the month of February, 1857. Doctor Lord, a **physician** of <u>Hillsdale of fifty</u> <u>years</u> practice, <u>made a most careful examination</u>, concerning which I present the following testimonials:"We were present when (in February, 1857) Sister <u>E. G. White</u> had a <u>vision</u> in Waldron's Hall, Hillsdale. Dr. Lord made an examination, and said, '<u>Her heart beats</u>, but <u>there is <u>no</u> <u>breath</u>. There is life, but no action of the lungs; I cannot account for this condition.''' Signed, "A. F. Fowler, Mrs. A. F. Fowler, Hillsdale, Mich., Jan.1, 1891.''</u>

George I. Butler – 1874

"<u>While she is in</u> <u>vision</u>, <u>her</u> <u>breathing entirely ceases</u>. <u>No</u> <u>breath</u> ever escapes her nostrils or lips when in this condition. <u>This has</u> <u>been proved by many witnesses</u>, among them physicians of skill, and themselves unbelievers in the visions, on some occasions being appointed by a public congregation for the purpose. It has been proved many times by <u>tightly holding the nostrils and mouth with the hand</u>, and by putting a looking glass before them so close that any escape of the moisture of the breath would be detected. In this condition she often speaks words and short sentences, yet not the slightest breath escapes.

Often she **loses her strength** temporarily and reclines or sits; but at other times she stands up. She moves her arms gracefully, and often her face is lighted up with radiance as though the glory of heaven rested upon her. She is utterly unconscious of everything going on around her while she is in vision, having no knowledge whatever of what is said and done in her presence.

When she comes out of this condition she speaks and writes from time to time what she has seen while in vision; and <u>the</u> <u>supernatural character of these visions is seen even more clearly in what</u> <u>she thus reveals than in her appearance and</u> <u>condition while in vision, for many things have thus been related which</u> <u>it was impossible for her to know in any other way.</u>

All we ask is that people shall be reasonable. We are prepared to support by hundreds of living truthful witnesses all that we shall claim, so far as facts are concerned, of the manifestation itself, for this thing has not been done in a corner. For nearly thirty years past these visions have been given with greater or less frequency, and have been witnessed by many, oftentimes by unbelievers as well as those believing them. They generally, but not always, occur in the midst of earnest seasons of religious interest while the Spirit of God is specially present, if those can tell who are in attendance. The time Mrs. White is in this condition has varied from fifteen minutes to one hundred and eighty. During this time the heart and pulse continue to beat, the eves are always wide open, and seem to be gazing at some far-distant object, and are never fixed on any person or thing in the room. They are always directed upward. They exhibit a pleasant expression. There is no ghastly look or any resemblance of fainting. The brightest light may be suddenly brought near her eyes, or feints made as if to thrust something into the eye, and there is never the slightest wink or change of expression on that account;

These things can be proved by any amount of testimony, and we confidently affirm that they are of such a character that they could not be accomplished by deception." – *Review and Herald*, June 9, 1874.

We give the following statement from an individual who witnessed a medical examination of <u>Mrs. White</u> while in vision at Stowe, Vermont, in summer of 1853. He says: "A <u>physician was present</u>, and made such examination of her as his wisdom and learning dictated, to find the cause of the manifestation. <u>A lighted candle was held close to <u>her eyes</u>, which were <u>wide open</u>; not a muscle of the eye moved. He then examined her in regard to her pulse, and also <u>in regard to her **breathing**</u>, and <u>there was **no respiration**</u>. The result was that he was satisfied that it could not be accounted for on natural or scientific principles." Signed, "F. C. Castle."</u>

Conclusions:

The inspiration and authority of the Ellen G. White writings

A statement of present understanding

1. The Holy Scriptures

The Holy Scriptures, Old and New Testaments, are the written Word of God, given by divine inspiration through holy men of God who spoke and wrote as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. In this Word, God has committed to man the knowledge necessary for salvation. The Holy Scriptures are the infallible revelation of His will. They are the standard of character, the test of experience, the authoritative revealer of doctrines, and the trustworthy record of God's acts in history. (2 Peter 1: 20, 21; 2 Tim. 3: 16,Ps. 119: 105; Prov. 30: 5, 6; Isa.8: 20; john 17: 17; I Thess. 2: 13; Heb. 4: 12.)

17. The Gift of Prophecy

One of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is prophecy. This gift is an identifying mark of the remnant church and was manifested in the ministry of Ellen G. White. As the Lord's messenger, her writings are a continuing and authoritative source of truth which provide for the church comfort, guidance, instruction, and correction. They also make clear that the Bible is the standard buy which all teaching and experience must be tested. (Joel 2: 28, 29; Acts 2: 14-21; Heb. 1: 1-3; Rev. 12: 17; 19: 10.)

The following affirmations and denials speak to the issues which have been raised about the inspiration and authority of the Ellen White writings and their relation to the Bible. These clarifications should be taken as a whole. They are an attempt to express the present understanding of Seventh-day Adventists. They are not to be construed as a substitute for, or a part of, the two doctrinal statements quoted above.

Affirmations

- 1. We believe that Scripture is the divine revealed Word of God and is inspired by the Holy Spirit.
- 2. We believe that the canon of Scripture is composed only of the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments.
- 3. We believe that Scripture is the foundation of faith and the final authority on all matters of doctrine and practice.
- 4. We believe that Scripture is the Word of God in human language.
- 5. We believe that Scripture teaches that the gift of prophecy will be manifested in the Christian church after New Testament times.
- 6. We believe that the ministry and writings of Ellen White were a manifestation of the gift of prophecy.
- 7. We believe that Ellen White was inspired by the Holy Spirit and that her writings, the product of that inspiration, are applicable and authoritative especially to Seventh-day Adventists.
- 8. We believe that the purpose of the Ellen White writings include guidance in understanding the teaching of Scripture and application of these teachings, with prophetic urgency, to the spiritual and moral life.
- 9. We believe that the acceptance of the prophetic gift of Ellen White is important to the nurture and unity of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
- 10. We believe that Ellen White's use of literary sources and assistants finds parallels in some of the writings of the Bible.

Denials

- 1. We do not believe that the quality or degree of inspiration in the writings of Ellen White is different from that of Scripture.
- 2. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White are an addition to the canon of Sacred Scripture.
- 3. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White function as the foundation and final authority of Christian faith as does the Scripture.
- 4. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White may be used as the basis of doctrine.
- 5. We do not believe that the study of the writings of Ellen White may be used to replace the study of Scripture.
- 6. We do not believe that Scripture can be understood only through the writings of Ellen White.
- 7. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White exhaust the meaning of Scripture.
- 8. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White are essential for the proclamation of the truths of Scripture to society at large.
- 9. We do not believe that the writings of Ellen White are the product of mere Christian piety
- 10. We do not believe that Ellen White's use of literary sources and assistants negates the inspiration of her writings.

We conclude, therefore, that a correct understanding of the inspiration and authority of the writings of Ellen White will avoid two extremes: (1) regarding these writings as functioning on a canonical level identical with Scripture, or (2) considering them as ordinary Christian literature.

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
