Study to know what God says

Do not read the Word in the light of former opinions. Do not try to make everything agree with your creed. With a mind free from prejudice, search the Word carefully.

We cannot obtain wisdom without earnest attention and prayerful study. Some portions of the Scriptures are indeed too plain to be misunderstood; but there are others whose meaning does not lie on the surface, to be seen at a glance. Scripture must be compared with Scripture. There must be careful research and prayerful attention. And such study will be richly repaid. As the miner discovers veins of precious metal concealed beneath the surface of the earth, so will he who perseveringly searches the Word of God as for hid treasure, find truths of the greatest value, which are concealed from the view of the careless seeker.

Never should the Bible be studied without prayer. Before opening its pages we should ask for enlightenment of the Holy Spirit, and it will be given.

The Hidden Treasure of the Bible

"We do not perceive the meaning of the word of God without much study; but the reward of the study of the Bible is exceedingly precious to him who fears God, and earnestly searches for truth as for **hidden treasure**. At the present day there are a large number in our churches who are not sufficiently interested in Bible study to seek to understand the mysteries of truth. They do not go below the surface. Those who are living in these last days, who acknowledge the binding claims of the law of God, have no ordinary responsibility. They are not to be satisfied with the surface truths. That which lies plainly revealed, which costs us no effort, will not be esteemed as highly as the treasure that costs us diligent, prayerful research and investigation.

Celestial truth is represented as treasure hid in a field, "which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field" (Matthew 13:44) that he may work every part of it to discover the golden ore or precious gems. The earth itself cannot reveal treasures of as great value as can the Bible. No toil can so repay the diligent worker as can the search for truth. Let the mines of revelation be properly worked, and the unsearchable riches of Christ will be revealed."


The **Teaching Methods** of Jesus

"Teachers should **copy** the example of the Great Teacher, who from familiar scenes of nature drew illustrations that simplified His teaching and impressed them more deeply upon the minds of his hearers. He connected the **visible works** of the Creator, with the **Words of life** which He spoke, that when ever these **objects** should be presented to the eyes of the hearer, their thoughts might revert to the <u>lessons of truth</u> He had linked with them".

PRINCIPLES FOR BIBLE STUDY

STUDY PRINCIPLE 1

Pray for the Holy Spirit to **guide you** as you study the Bible and search for truth.

James 1:5 If any lack wisdom let him ask of God

John 16:13 When He the **Spirit** of truth is come He will **guide you** into all truth.

STUDY PRINCIPLE 2

Let the **Bible** explain itself. One text will prove to be a **key** that will **unlock** other texts, and in this way you will discover the **hidden meaning** of God's Word.

1 Cor. 2:13 "...not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the **Holy Ghost** teacheth; **comparing** spiritual things with spiritual".

In simple language, <u>using</u> **figures** and <u>illustrations drawn from the natural world</u>, He opened **spiritual truth** to His hearers..." **6**

"So it was with Christ's teaching the unknown was illustrated by the known; divine truths by earthly things with which the people were familiar".

Jesus uses Nature to teach us Spiritual Lessons

Object of Nature: OIL

Bible Verse: 1 Samuel 16:13

"Then Samuel took the horn of **oil**, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the **spirit** of the Lord came upon David from that day forward".

By examining the uses or functions of the REAL OBJECT in Nature we will discover, why God chose "oil" to represent His Holy Spirit.

What are some of the uses for Oil?

To lubricate

Physical **Oil** helps parts to work together without friction.

Spiritual **Holy Spirit** helps church members to work together without friction and fighting with each other.

2. Burned to give Light

Physical **Oil** helps us to see where we are going Physically when there is darkness all around us.

Spiritual **Holy Spirit** helps us to see Truth from the Bible so that we can see where we are going Spiritually and avoid the evil all around us.

3. Put Moisture back in our bodies

Physical **Oil** helps members of our Physical body such as our face, and hands, which have become dry and hard to become soft and flexible.

Spiritual **Holy Spirit** helps members of the Spiritual Body of Christ (Church), who have become dry and hard set in their ways, to become soft and flexible and willing to change.

4. Burned to provide Heat

Physical Oil provides the heat to keep our bodies Physically warm.

Spiritual **Holy Spirit** provides the warmth of God's Love, to keep His Body, the Church, Spiritually Warm and on fire for Him.

5. We need an "Oil change"

Eph.2:2 "...the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience". We need the **Holy Spirit** from the Lord instead of the unholy spirit of Satan.

Jesus uses Nature to teach us Spiritual Lessons

Object of Nature: CAVE Bible Verse: 1 Samuel 22:1

> "David therefore departed thence, and escaped to the cave Adullam: and when his brethren and all his fathers house heard it,

they went down thither to him".

PHYSICAL

What is the use or function of a **CAVE**?

A cave would be a place to live if you had left your home and were in the wilderness.

What are the characteristics of a **CAVE**?

A cave is dark, and needs light. A cave is in the earth.

SPIRITUAL

What spiritual lesson does this object of Nature, a cave teach us?

Jesus left His home in heaven, a place of great light, and came to live on this dark earth. He is the light of this world and helps us see truth in the midst of Spiritual darkness.

Object of Nature: **BREAD** Bible Verse: 1 Samuel 21:3

> "Now therefore what is under thine hand? Give me five loaves of **bread** in mine hand, or what there is present".

PHYSICAL

What is BREAD used for?

For Physical food: When we eat Physical bread, it gives us Physical strength, to do Physical work.

SPIRITUAL

When we "eat Spiritual bread" (read and understand the Bible), it gives us Spiritual strength, to do Spiritual work for Jesus.

When we eat Physical bread, it gives us the ability to live about 70 years. When we "eat" Spiritual bread (accept Jesus the Bread of Life), He gives us the ability to live forever!

Only Jesus can satisfy the Spiritual hunger of people and only Jesus can give us Eternal Life!

Early Church Pioneer's Method of Bible Study William Miller – His understanding Made Clear

"Endeavoring to lay aside all preconceived opinions, and dispensing with commentaries, he compared scripture with scripture by the aid of the marginal references and the concordance.

He pursued his study in a regular and methodical manner; Beginning with Genesis, and reading verse by verse, he proceeded no faster than the meaning of the several passages so unfolded as to leave him free from all embarrassment.

When he found anything obscure, it was his custom to compare it with every other text which seemed to have any reference to the matter under consideration.

Every word was permitted to have its proper bearing upon the subject of the text, and if his view of it harmonized with every collateral passage, it ceased to be a difficulty. Thus whenever he met with a passage hard to be understood he found an explanation in some other portion of the Scriptures.

As he studied with earnest prayer for divine enlightenment, that which had before appeared dark to his understanding was made clear. He experienced the truth of the psalmist words: "The entrance of Thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple". Ps.119:130

With intense interest he studied the books of Daniel and Revelation, employing the same principles of interpretation as in the other Scriptures, and found, to his great joy, that the prophetic symbols could be understood. He saw that the prophecies, so far as they had been fulfilled, had been fulfilled literally; that all the various figures, metaphors, parables, similitude, etc... were either explained in their immediate connection, or the terms in which they were expressed were defined in other Scriptures, and when thus explained, were to be literally understood. "I was thus satisfied" he says, "that the Bible is a system of revealed truths, so clearly and simply given that the wayfaring man, though a fool, need not err therein".

William Miller's Method of Bible Study

- 1. He compared "Scripture with Scripture" using a Concordance.
- Whenever something was "obscure" or hidden from his understanding, he compared it with every other text which seemed to have any reference to the matter.
- 3 Every hard to understand passage of scripture was explained in some other portion of Scripture.
- 4 The books of Daniel and Revelation were understood using the same principles of interpretation as were used in the other Scriptures.
- 5 The "terms" in which the figures, parables, metaphors, similitude, etc... were expressed were defined in the other Scriptures and when thus explained were to be understood literally.











Teaching in Parables

"Again, Christ had **truths** to present which the people were unprepared to accept or even to understand. For this reason also He taught them in **parables**. By connecting His teaching with the scenes of life, experience, or nature, He secured their attention and impressed their hearts. Afterward, as they looked upon the **objects** that illustrated His lessons, they recalled the words of the divine Teacher. To minds that were open to the Holy Spirit, the significance of the Savior's teaching unfolded more and more. Mysteries grew clear, and that which had been hard to grasp became evident.

Jesus sought an avenue to every heart. By using a variety of illustrations, He not only presented truth in its different phases, but appealed to the different hearers. Their interest was aroused by figures drawn from the surroundings of their daily life.

Parable teaching was popular, and commanded the respect and attention, not only of the Jews, but of the people of other nations. No more effective method of instruction could He have employed.

The Parable of Treasure Hid in a Field

Matthew 13:44 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto **treasure hid in a field**; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field".

COMMENT:

This parable describes someone who has found something of the **greatest value!** He is willing to give up everything in order to obtain it. Instead of being sorrowful because he has to give up everything, the man is filed with **joy** at the thought of what he will gain!

In order to discover the **Spiritual** meaning of this parable, we will first have to discover the **Spiritual Meaning** of the real objets used in the parable. The real objects are: **field**, **treasure**, and **man**.

Comparing Scripture: Prov.2:3-5 (**treasure**) "Yea if thou criest after knowledge and liftest up thy voice for understanding; if thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for **hid treasures**; then shalt thou understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God.

Hid Treasure = Knowledge of God

COMMENT:

The only place that we can search for the "hid treasure" of the knowledge of God is in **God's Word**. Thus, the "**field**" represents the Bible or **Word of God**.

Field = Word of God (Bible)

COMMENT:

The "treasure" was hidden in the field. It did not lie on the surface of the ground, but was buried beneath the surface. To obtain the "treasure" required the "work" of digging. Similarly, to obtain the **knowledge of God** and the understanding of the Gospel, requires the "work" of digging or searching the Scriptures.

Matthew 6:19-21 "Lay not up for yourselves **treasures** upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and thieves break through and steal: but lay up for yourselves **treasures** in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your **treasure** is there will your **heart** be also".

COMMENT:

To "give up your treasure" upon the earth and to "lay up your treasure" in heaven, means to "turn your heart" from the things of this world and to "give your heart" to Jesus and the things of heaven.

Spiritual Meaning:

Matthew 13:44 (paraphrase) Again, the kingdom of heaven is like the knowledge of God (treasure) that is hidden in the Word of God (field); which when a man discovers, with joy gives his heart completely to Jesus (sells all) so that he can obtain (buy) the knowledge of God (treasure) that is hidden in the Bible (field).

Doctrinal Truth

(Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of **Treasure** hid in a field)

- 1. There is a "**treasure**" that is worth giving up everything to obtain.
- 2. For humans the "treasure" is a knowledge of God and Salvation and Eternal Life that comes with that knowledge.
- 3. In order for us to obtain our "treasure", nothing must be withheld. The price of the "treasure" is so high (Jesus had to die) that it requires us to give our **hearts** completely to Jesus.
- 4. In order for us to obtain the "treasure", "digging" will be required of us. Digging represents the "work" of searching or comparing the Scriptures to obtain a knowledge of God and Salvation.
- 5. When the "treasure" is obtained it will bring joy into our lives!

The Treasures of God's Word

"The kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field, the which when a man hath found, he hideth it, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field"

"The field containing the treasure represents the Word of God. As the treasure was found in this field, so by earnest searching, treasure is found in the Scriptures.

If men had closely, earnestly, continuously studied God's Word, making the Bible its own commentator, the key with which to unlock the Scriptures, they would have been as much astonished at the golden treasures revealed, as was the man who found the treasure in the field. But men have departed from God's great lesson book, and their senses have become confused".

The Bible: A Means of Spiritual Growth

"And even greater is the power of the Bible in the development of the spiritual nature. Man, created for fellowship with God, can only in such fellowship find his real life and development.

Created to find in God his highest joy, he can find in nothing else that which can quiet the cravings of the heart, or satisfy the hunger and thirst of the soul.

He who with sincere and teachable spirit studies God's Word, seeking to comprehend its truths, will be brought into touch with its Author, and, except by his own choice, there is no limit to the possibilities of his development.

In childhood, youth, and manhood Jesus studied the Scriptures. As a little child, He was daily, at His mother's knee, taught from the scrolls of the prophets. In His youth the early morning and evening twilight often found Him alone on the mountainside or among the trees of the forest, spending a quiet hour in prayer and in the study of God's Word. During His ministry His intimate acquaintance with the Scriptures testified to His diligence in their study.

And since He gained knowledge as we may gain it, His wonderful power, both mental and spiritual, is a testimony to the value of the Bible as a means of education".

IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER WHEN STUDYING THE BIBLE

- 1. Always use the King James Bible.
- 2. Use **Strongs Concordance** and learn how to "compare the Scriptures" and how to look up the meaning of any word in its Hebrew or Greek Dictionaries.
- Always consider the relationship between the **Physical** and the **Spiritual** in any Bible text.
 (Physical Bread / Spiritual Bread)
- 4. If the text you are studying has **Real Objects** in it, it will have a **deeper meaning** than what is on the surface.
- 5. Locate each Real Object and determine its Spiritual Meaning by using the Bible Word Pictures reference booklet. If the object is not in the Reference Booklet use the Concordance and compare the Scriptures until you find the Spiritual Meaning.
- 6. **Substitute** the **Spiritual Meaning** of each object back into the verse and **Paraphrase** the verse.
- 7. Do **not** speculate as to the meaning of any Bible Text. **Always** let the Bible explain itself.

A MEANS OF INTELLECTUAL GROWTH

"When thus searched out and brought together, they will be found to be perfectly fitted to one another. Each Gospel is a supplement to the others, every prophecy an explanation of another, every truth a development of some other truth.

The types of the Jewish economy are made plain by the Gospel. Every principle in the Word of God has its place, every fact its bearing, and the complete structure, in design and execution, bears testimony to its Author. Such a structure no mind but the Infinite could conceive or fashion.

Not alone in searching out truth and bringing it together does the mental value of Bible study consist.

It consists also in the effort required to grasp the themes presented. The mind occupied with common place matters only becomes dwarfed and enfeebled. If never taxed to comprehend grand and far reaching truths, it after a time loses the power of growth. As a safeguard against this degeneracy, and a stimulus to development, nothing can equal the study of God's Word. As a means for intellectual training, the Bible is more effective than any other book, or all other books combined.

The greatness of its themes, the dignified simplicity of its utterances, the beauty of its imagery, quicken and uplift the thoughts as nothing else can. No other study can impart such mental power as does the effort to grasp the stupendous truths of revelation. The mind thus brought in contact with the thoughts of the Infinite can not but expand and strengthen".

THE WORD TO BE OUR STUDY

"The Word is to be our study. Here is a mine of precious ore.

Much of it has been glimpsed at, but there is the digging to be done to secure much more precious treasures.

There have been many who have just rummaged over the surface in a most careless, slovenly manner, when others are searching more carefully and prayerfully and perseveringly, and hidden inestimable treasures are found".

It is of great value to be able to use a Concordance to help you study, so a brief description of

"How to use a Concordance" will now be given.

You use a concordance much like a dictionary. The words in a concordance are placed in alphabetical order and the concordance contains every word in the Bible and gives the location or Bible text where each word is found. When you want to explore a topic or subject you simply look up the word that describes your subject, such as "Angels" in your concordance and then proceed to read the Bible texts the concordance has listed for you.




Notice how much you can learn by reading the texts.

BIBLE STUDY PRINCIPLES

A concordance such as "Strong's" contains a complete Hebrew and Greek dictionary that will be a great help to you in trying to learn the meaning of words used in the Bible that are not used today or are hard to understand.

Note: Always use the King James Bible to study from.



HOW TO DISCOVER THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF A KEY WORD

KEY WORDS

- 1. Key Words are usually nouns or "real things" that can be seen or felt.
- 2. When attempting to find the Spiritual Meaning of a key word, watch for "parallelism", which is best described as "saying the same thing two different ways". This usually makes the Spiritual Meaning of the key word much easier to understand.

Example "Parallelism" of a Bible verse:

Psm.119:130 "The entrance of thy words giveth light;

it giveth understanding unto the simple".

COMPARING: Thy words giveth light

It giveth understanding.

CONCLUSION: To give light means

To give understanding

Thus, by comparing the "parallel" thoughts of a verse, we can arrive at the meaning of a key word.

We would then "add" this new key word to our Bible Vocabulary:

Key Word Spiritual Meaning Bible Ref.
Light Understanding Psm.119:130

3. Comparing "contrasting" Bible texts is another good way to discover the meaning of key words.

Example: "Contrasting" texts:

Prov.10:11 "The mouth of a righteous man is a well of life".

John 4:14 "But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst... shall be in him a well of water springing up into

everlasting life".

2Peter 2:1 "But there were false prophets also... as there shall be false teachers among you..".

2Peter 2:17 "These are wells without water...".

COMPARING:

false prophets, false teachers, wells without water

4. Use a Concordance, such as "Strongs" to locate a Key Word and then search the Bible texts for: the text or texts that reveal the "Spiritual Meaning" of the Key Word.

2. Quickly read the "partial sentences" using the Key Word in the Concordance to see if you can locate the Bible texts that are obviously using the Key Word in a "Spiritual Sense".

<u>Example</u>: *Jer.50:23* "...the hammer of the whole earth". (No real hammer is of the whole earth and therefore this must be a "Spiritual Hammer").

3. After locating, what appears to be a text using the Key Word in a Spiritual Sense, then look up that text in the Bible and read the complete text.

Example: Jer.50:23

How is the hammer of the whole earth cut asunder and broken! How is Babylon become a desolation among the nations!

4. Using "parallelism" discover the Spiritual Meaning of the Key Word:

COMPARING: hammer of whole earth... broken

Babylon among nations... desolation

CONCLUSION: Key Word "hammer" represents Babylon

5. Add new Key Word to Bible Vocabulary list:

Key Word Spiritual Meaning Bible Ref. hammer Babylon Jer.50:23

Sometimes there will be more than one Spiritual Meaning for a Key Word. This will be illustrated on the next page.

Sometimes there will be more than one Spiritual Meaning for a Key Word. Also, sometimes you have to read each text when the "partial sentences" in the Concordance do not reveal any obviously Spiritual Meaning of the Key Word.

Example: Jer.23:29 "...And like a hammer that breaketh...".

Not obviously Spiritual since a real hammer can break something.

Reading the complete text:

Jer.23:29 "Is not my word like as a fire? saith the Lord: and like a hammer that breaketh the rock in pieces?".

like a fire

CONCLUSION: 1. Key Word **hammer** represents God's Word (the Bible)
2. Key Word **fire** represents God's Word (the Bible)

When trying to understand the Spiritual Meaning of a Bible text by substituting the Spiritual Meaning of a Key Word in place of its literal one, it is important to use the "right" Spiritual Meaning when there is more than one meaning.

<u>Example</u>: Mat.13:33 "...Another parable spake he unto them: the kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven...".

Assuming "leaven" as the Key Word and checking our Bible Vocabulary List we find that there are two Spiritual Meanings for the Key Word "leaven":

Key WordSpiritual MeaningBible Ref.leavensin (malice and wickedness)1Cor.5:8leavendoctrineMat.16:6,12

Which Spiritual Meaning should be used? The context of the text being examined will tell you!

Substitute the Spiritual Meaning of Key Word into the text:

Mat.13:33 "...the kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven...". the kingdom of heaven is like unto "sin"

NO! Heaven is not like sin so this cannot be the "right" Spiritual Meaning.

Substitute the 2nd Spiritual Meaning of Key Word into the text:

Mat.13:33 "...the kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven...". the kingdom of heaven is like unto "doctrine"

YES! Heaven could be like doctrine so this is the "right" Spiritual Meaning.

When you discover a "Basic" Key Word a synonym will usually reveal the same meaning.

Example: Basic Key Word = garment

Synonyms: clothes, raiment, linen, apparel, robe

(They are all things to wear or to cover us)

For each Basic Key Word there are "shades of meaning" that are revealed by the adjectives describing the Basic Key Word.

Example: Basic Key Word = garment

"clean" garment (adjective: clean)

"filthy" garment (adjective: filthy)

The "Rock" BOZEZ represents the <u>True God</u> (CHRIST)

(shining, white, fine linen)

The "**rock**" **SENEH** represents the <u>False **God**</u> (SATAN) (thorn, to prick, bramble)

The two cities, as far apart as the compass directions of North and South, represent the "actions" of the two persons,

[NORTH] MICHMASH # 4363 HIDDEN

(hidden under a bushel)

[SOUTH] **GIBEAH** # 1390 <u>LITTLE HILL</u> (city set on a hill)

GODS "ACTIONS" are always in <u>plain view</u> while Satans "actions" are <u>secretive</u>.

The two directions, NORTH and SOUTH represent the "positions" of the two persons.

NORTH – The "**rightful**" **position** of God as our <u>ruler</u>, which has been <u>usurped</u> by **Satan** (*Isaiah 14 : 13*).

The <u>enemies</u> of Gods people always came from the **North**.

The "Valley" (passage between two cliffs) represents a decision.

Joel 3: 14 "Multitudes, multitudes in the <u>valley</u> of <u>decision</u>: for the day of the Lord is near in the <u>valley</u> of <u>decision</u>".

SUMMARY

(SPIRITUAL MEANING of the "ACTED PARABLE"

In the story or "acted parable", <u>Jonathan</u> is on a **journey** to **fight** with <u>his **enemy**</u>.

As he travels, he must pass through a **valley** where the **two rocks** are.

Jonathan represents a person on the "journey of life".

Each person must enter the "<u>valley of decision</u>" and they must **choose** between the "two **rocks**".

They will either choose: the "<u>rock BOZEZ</u>" which represents the **pure life** (shining, white, fine linen) of **CHRIST**, the <u>true **Rock**</u>, or they will choose the "<u>rock **SENEH**</u>" which represents the **wicked life** (prick, thorn, bramble) of **SATAN**.

HOW TO STUDY THE BIBLE

"When a real love for the Bible is awakened, and the student begins to realize how vast is the field and how precious the treasure, he will seize upon every opportunity for acquainting himself with God's Word.

We should not take the testimony of any man as to what the Scriptures teach, but should study the Word of God for ourselves. If we allow others to do our thinking for us, we shall have crippled energies and contracted abilities. The noble powers of the mind may be so dwarfed by lack of exercise in themes worthy of their concentration as to lose their ability to grasp the deep meaning of the Word of God. The mind will enlarge if it is employed in tracing out the relation of the subjects of the Bible, comparing Scripture with Scripture, and Spiritual things with Spiritual.

There is but little benefit derived from a hasty reading of the Scriptures. One may read the whole Bible through, and yet fail to see its beauty or comprehend its deep and hidden meaning. One passage studied until its significance is clear to the mind, and its relation to the plan of salvation is evident, is of more value than the perusal of many chapters with no definite purpose in view, and no positive instruction gained".

The **Cedar Tree**

"Teachers should **copy** the example of the **Great Teacher**, who from the familiar scenes of nature drew illustrations that simplified His teaching and impressed them more deeply upon the minds of His hearers. He <u>connected</u> the **visible works** of the Creator, with the **Words of life** which He spoke that whenever these **objects** should be presented to the eyes of the hearer, their thoughts might revert to the lessons of truth He had linked with them".

The Cedar Tree and Jesus

Psa.92:12 "The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall **grow** like a cedar in Lebanon".

<u>Question</u>: Why should Christians (the righteous) grow to be like the **Cedar** Tree?

The **Cedar Tree** is not beautiful on the outside: its shaggy, paper like bark, hanging in peeled off strips on the outside of its trunk is not attractive.

Similarly, **Jesus** was not beautiful on the outside: "For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him". Isa.53:2

But, the **Cedar Tree** is beautiful on the inside!!! It has a **beautiful smell** and a beautiful **blood red color** inside.

Similarly, **Jesus** is beautiful on the inside!!! His **righteousness**, represented by the **beautiful smell**, and **His Blood** shed for us, represented by the **blood red color**. "And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savour". Eph.5:2

The **Cedar Tree** is not like other trees whose leaves die each year. It remains always **Green**.

Similarly, **Jesus** is not like other men who must die without hope. He has **conquered death** and **lives forever** to give us Hope.

As the **smell** of a **Cedar Tree** protects our **clothing** from being eaten by moths, so the **Righteousness** of **Jesus** protects our spiritual garment, **our character**, from Satan's attacks.


Now we know why Christians are to grow to be like the Cedar Tree. By growing to be like the Cedar Tree we are growing to be like **Jesus**.





HOW TO DISCOVER THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF:

An "Acted Parable" or Bible Story"

The Apostle Paul tells us the reason:

1 Cor 10: 1, 5, 11 "Moreover, brethren, I would not that ye should be ignorant, how that all our fathers were under the cloud, and all passed through the sea;... But with many of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the wilderness.... Now **all** these things happened unto them for **ensamples**: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come".

Thus, the "<u>stories</u>" of things that happened long ago to the people of God are <u>models or ensamples</u> or **Acted Parables** of <u>things to be</u> repeated again during the last days of earths history!

Strong's Concordance gives the meaning for **ensample** from the Greek as:

5179 tupos (from # 5180 tupto) a <u>model</u> for warning, a type, a figure # 5180 tupto <u>repeated</u> blows.

The Spirit of Prophecy has this to say:

"In the days of Jeremiah, the Lord taught the people by means of a series of **Acted Parables**". Prophets and Kings (page 423).

"He taught spiritual lessons in every miracle performed... the cursing of the fig tree was an **Acted Parable**".

Desire of Ages pages 266, 267, 336, 341, 582.

Thus in <u>both</u> **Old** and **New Testaments** there are "<u>Acted Parables</u>" for us to learn from.

"I have been shown that in <u>both the Old and New Testaments</u> are mines of truth that have scarcely been touched. The truths revealed in the <u>Old Testament</u> are the <u>truths of the Gospel of Christ</u>. Heavenly veins of truth are **lying beneath the surface of Old Testament history**. Precious pearls of truth are to be gathered up, which will require not only laborious effort, but spiritual enlightenment". Review & Herald Feb.4,1890.

UNDERSTANDING AN ACTED PARABLE

- 1. Read the Bible story to get an overview of what is happening.
- 2. Go through the "story" verse by verse and in your own words first write down what happened Physically or Literally. Write the word "Physical" before each Real Object. Read what you have just written but substitute the word "Spiritual" every place you wrote the word "Physical". If you had written "Physical sword", you would now think "Spiritual sword" or the Bible etc..
- Locate the Key Words in the story and substitute their Spiritual Meaning into the story and re-read the story in that manner in order to see the deeper meaning of the story that is not on the surface.
- 4. Notice any "familiar phrases" that you recall from the New Testament, because this will positively identify the Main Theme of the Acted Parable and lead you to the Spiritual Meaning.
- 5. Notice any "names" of people, cities, or objects and look up those names in a Concordance such as Strongs to see the meaning of the name in the Hebrew or Greek Dictionary as the meaning will lead you to the main thought.
- 6. Identify who the "actors" in the story are and "who they represent", and whether they are on the side of "good" or "evil". Let the context of the story tell you whether you have chosen correctly. All of the "pieces" must fit together and harmonize completely with the rest of the Bible.
- 7. Then, using the knowledge you have gained from studying the Spiritual Meaning of Key Words, names, actors you have identified, and phrases, re-write the "Acted Parable" in your own words with the Spiritual Meaning!

Old Testament "Acted Parable" of: Jonathan and David (1Sam.18:1-4)

HOW TO STUDY THE BIBLE The Mind Which Obtains Knowledge

"A knowledge of the Word of God depends not so much upon strength of intellect as upon pureness of purpose, the simplicity of an earnest, dependent faith.

To those who in humility of heart seek for divine guidance, angels of God draw near.

The Holy Spirit is given to open to them the rich treasures of truth.

But the most valuable teaching of the Bible is not gained by occasional or disconnected study. Its great system of truth is not so presented as to be discerned by the careless or hasty reader.

Many of its treasures lie far beneath the surface, and can only be obtained by diligent research and continuous effort.

The truths that go to make up the great whole must be searched out and gathered up "here a little and there a little".

On the contrary, it was **designed for the common people**; and the interpretation given by the common people, when aided by the Holy Spirit, accords best with the truth as it is in Jesus. The great truths necessary for salvation are made clear as the noonday, and none will mistake and lose their way except those who follow their own judgment instead of the plainly revealed will of God". **15**

"They had the word of God in their hands: but the traditions which had been handed down from generation to generation, and the human interpretation of the Scriptures, hid from them the truth as it is in Jesus. The spiritual import of the sacred writings was lost. The treasure house of all knowledge was open to them, but they knew it not. God does not conceal His truth from men. By their own course of action they make it obscure to themselves".

Consider the context to determine the subject

Matthew 6

28 "And why take ye thought for <u>raiment</u>? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they <u>spin</u>:

29 And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not <u>arrayed</u> like one of these. 30 Wherefore, if God so <u>clothe</u> the grass of the filed, which today is, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more <u>clothe</u> you, O ye of little faith?

31 Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Where withal shall we be <u>clothed</u>?

What is the Main Subject?

The <u>main subject</u> is **clothing** that God wants to give us! We can't work for it. It is a gift from God. The Spiritual Clothing that He wants to give us is His **Robe Of righteousness**!

Isaiah 61:10 "...My soul shall be joyful in my God for He hath clothed me with the garment of salvation, He hath covered me with the robe of righteousness..."

1 Corinthians 2

- 7 "But we speak the <u>wisdom of God</u> in a mystery, even the <u>hidden</u> <u>wisdom</u>, which God ordained before the world unto our glory:
- 8 Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.
- 9 But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear head, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.

The Main Subject is:

The **hidden wisdom** of God or the **deep things** of God which are in the Bible, but can only be understood as the Holy Spirit teaches us as we <u>compare Scripture</u> with Scripture or "spiritual **things** with spiritual".

An "Acted Parable"

"Acted Parable" of DAVID and GOLIATH (1 Samuel 17:1-51)

- 4 "And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span:
- 8 And he stood and cried unto the armies of Israel, and said unto them, why are ye come out to set your battle in array? Am I not a Philistine, an ye servants of Saul? Choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me:
- 9 If he be able to fight with me, and kill me, then we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and kill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve us:

4. Paraphrase the "Acted Parable" and Think about the Spiritual

There was a "man" named **Satan** from **the land of Justice and Judgment**, who was much stronger Spiritually than any of God's people. He challenged one man named **Jesus** to fight with him Spiritually. All the human race were to be his servants if he won the Spiritual contest. For forty days **Satan** tempted and taunted and challenged **Jesus**. But **Jesus** from Bethlehem, "The Shepherd of Israel", met his challenge! With the help of God, His Father, Jesus used the **Ten Commandments** written on tables of stone, to Spiritually defeat the mind of Satan!

Thus, the "**Great controversy**" between Christ and Satan as an "Acted Parable".

THE TREASURES OF GOD'S WORD

"In his lessons Christ sought to reach the understanding through the actual occurrences and events that take place in this world. <u>Instruction</u> of the **highest value** is given in the **parables** by which Christ illustrated the spiritual character of his kingdom. The Great Teacher used the things of nature, to reflect the wisdom of the Creator. Human life in all its bearings is similar to nature.

Nature and human life obey the commands of God. They answer to his majestic, wonder-working power.

And he who created the world and made the lofty mountains, who opened the fountains of the great deep, who formed the mighty rocks and the lofty trees, has given man power to appreciate these wonders of earth and heaven, power to understand the lessons, drawn from them by Christ. But human intelligence could never have originated these lessons, and neither can man understand them only as God by his Holy Spirit sanctifies the observation.

When the mind is freed from perverting influences, it can receive and understand these lessons.

The field containing the treasure represents the word of God. As the treasure was found in this field, so by earnest searching, treasure is found in the Scriptures.

If men had closely, earnestly, continuously studied God's word, making the <u>Bible its own commentator</u>, the **key** with which to <u>unlock Scripture</u>, they would have been as much astonished at the golden treasures revealed as was the man who found the treasure in the filed. But men have departed from God's great lesson book, and their senses have become confused."

The Parable of: The Two Men that built Houses

Matthew 7:24-27

24 "Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:

245 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock.

26 And everyone that heareth these sayings of mine and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand:

27 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it".

Paraphrase

The one who hears what Jesus says and does it, is a wise man! He is like a man that built his house upon a rock.

The one who hears what Jesus says and does not do it, is a foolish man!

He is like a man that built his house on sand. When the rain, wind, and floods beat upon the two houses, only the one built upon the rock remained.

The house built upon sand was destroyed.

Comments:

Nothing is said in the parable about the type of house being built. One house could have been a mansion on the sand by the seashore and the other house a log cabin on a rock in the mountains. Nothing is said about the materials that the houses were built out of. One house may have been built with marble stones and gold and silver, while the other house may have been built from wood and iron. There are several things that the parable does tell us. It tells us what the men building the houses were like!

One man was a wise man. The other man was foolish.

The parable also tells us that there was a <u>difference</u> between the **foundations** of the <u>two houses</u>. The wise man had chosen to build his house upon a **rock** for his foundation. The foolish man had chosen to build his house upon **sand** for his foundation. No one forced either man to build in a certain way. Each man chose the foundation for his house.

The whole parable seems to center around the fact that <u>choosing</u> the **right foundation** is what made one man **wise** and one man **foolish**.

Jesus compares this choice to being like two men who listened to what He said.

One man listened and did what Jesus said to do. The other man listened and did not do what Jesus said to do.

Thus, the primary teaching of this parable is very clear.

You will Do what Jesus says if you are wise!!

The second teaching of this parable is also clear. You must choose the right foundation to build on or all the rest of your efforts will be in vain!!!

Let's compare our two choices for "foundations"

1. ROCK

or

2. SAND

Summarizing

The differences between these two foundation materials:



Now we need to discover what the Bible says that "rock" and "sand" represent Spiritually, so that we will understand why these two "foundation" materials are so important!



ROCK = CHRIST 1Cor.10:4 "... They drank of that Spiritual Rock that followed them: and that Rock was Christ".



SAND = People

Joshua 11:4
"And they went out, they and all their hosts with them, much people, even as the sand upon the seashore...".

Rock = Christ (God)

Sand = people (man)

Thus, the two possible "**foundations**" upon which we can build are either:

1. Rock God's Words
or

2. Sand man's words

Spiritual "ROCK" CHRIST

Spiritual "SAND" MAN

God is Immovable .	Man is easily moved .
God is Changeless	Man changes constantly.
Anyone "attached" to God is Spiritually secure .	Anyone "attached" to man is Spiritually unsecure .
God will "support" anyone who stands or depends upon Him and He will not let them "sink" Spiritually.	Man cannot "support" anyone who "stands" or depends upon him and anyone who does depend upon man will "sink" Spiritually.
God is not affected by the Spiritual " Elements " of Satan and is never deceived .	Man is affected by the Spiritual "Elements" and is easily deceived.

These "differences" clearly show us the advantage of "building on Rock" (God) for a "foundation" instead of "building on sand" (man).

Now we know why Christ gave this parable right after the parable of the Two Ways (broad and narrow), and after telling us to **beware of false teachers** and to "test their fruits".

Now, He has once again warned us **not to trust** in the words of men, but rather to trust in the Words of God!

Jer.17:5,7 "...Cursed be the man that trusteth in man...Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord...".

So, the "**foundation**" of our beliefs MUST be based on the Words of God instead of the words of men or we are foolish and cursed.

"Christ is the truth. His words are truth, and they have a greater value and a deeper significance, than appears on the surface. All the sayings of Christ have a value beyond their unpretending appearance.

Minds that are quickened by the Holy Spirit will discern the value of these sayings. They will discern the precious gems of truth though they may be buried treasure.

How needful for all who are workers in the cause of God to ponder these things, that they may guard against self-sufficiency.

If men are self-sufficient, the Lord leaves them to their own human wisdom. We are not to trust in self".

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"There are rich treasures for us in the mine of God's Word, and we must dig deep for the precious jewels of truth.

The rubbish of human opinion must be swept aside, that the clear jewels of truth may be brought to light; for we want the truth on every point, that we may be sanctified through the truth".

The Story that the Bible tells us about the "Word" POTTER

Literal Story

The potter treads the clay.

The Lord is the potter and we are the clay.

The potter made a vessel of clay but it became flawed so the potter made it into another vessel.

As the potter takes clay in his hand to form it, so the Lord can take His people and change them.

The people of God, the work of the hands of the potter, are as valuable as gold to Him, but to others they are as worthless as clay pitchers. The potter himself was only valued at 30 pieces of silver. From the same lump of clay the potter makes vessels of which some will bring him honor and some will bring dishonor.

The potter will break in pieces some of the vessels he has made.

Spiritual Story

The Lord is the potter and we are the clay. The Lord has power over the people just like a potter has power over the clay. The Lord made a man from the clay of the earth but the man made a mistake. Just as a potter can take the clay and make a new vessel out of it, the Lord can take a man that has made a mistake and change him into a new man. A person that God has changed is very valuable to Him, but to others he is as worthless as a clay pitcher. The Lord Himself was not of value to his own people. They sold Him for only 30 pieces of silver, the price of a slave.

Just as a potter takes the same lump of clay and makes some vessels that will bring him honor and others that will bring him dishonor, so the Lord has made all men from the clay of the earth and some men will bring Him honor and others will bring Him dishonor.

The Lord will rule over all men and He will destroy those who bring Him dishonor.

By **parables** Christ revealed the <u>mysteries of redemption</u>. His hearers were familiar with the things of **nature**, and these he used to represent the spiritual truths he wished to communicate. All had an opportunity to hear his appeals as they were made in sympathy for men. In the synagogue, by the wayside, and in the boat thrust out a little from the land, he spoke to the people, feeding their famished souls with the bread of life.

Christ presented his <u>truths</u> in **parables**, in the form of a story. The Pharisees would not listen to direct truth; but parable teaching was popular, and commanded the respect and attention not only of the Jews, but also of the people of other nations.

Christ knew there were many who would keep these lessons in mind until their **hidden meaning** should be discerned, but that others would never reach to their deep meaning. The disciples would come to the Great Teacher to inquire, and he instructed them. Christ gladly taught all who had interest enough to say, explain to us the meaning of your words.

These <u>lessons of Christ</u> were to be <u>repeated by his disciples</u>. When Peter, Andrew, James and John were called by Christ to forsake their nets and follow him, the promise was given them, "I will make you fishers of men". those uneducated peasants of Galilee were to fulfill the divine commission.

Through them <u>Christ's lessons</u> were to be <u>carried to all peoples</u>, <u>nations and tongues</u>.







Study the Difficult Passages

"Search the Scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life".

To search means to look diligently for something. Search for the **hidden treasures** in God's Word. You can not afford to be without them.

Study the difficult passages, **comparing verse with verse**, and you will find that Scripture is the **key** which **unlocks** Scripture.

Those who prayerfully study the Bible go from each search wiser than they were before. That which is worth having is not obtained without earnest, persevering **effort**.

In business life those only who are willing to put forth determined effort see successful results.

Without earnest toil we **cannot expect** to obtain a knowledge of **spiritual things**. Those who find the jewels of truth must dig for them as the miner digs for the precious ore hidden in the earth."

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STUDY ONE VERSE

"As our Physical life is sustained by **food**, so our Spiritual life is sustained by the **Word of God**. As we must **eat for ourselves** in order to obtain nourishment, so we must receive the Word **for ourselves**. We are not to obtain it merely through the medium of another's mind.

We should carefully study the Bible, asking God for the aid of the Holy Spirit, that we may understand His Word.

We should take **one verse**, and concentrate the mind on the task of ascertaining the thought that God has in that verse for us.

We should dwell upon the thought until it becomes our own, and we know "what saith the Lord".

One passage studied until its significance is clear to the mind, and its relationship to the plan of salvation is evident, is of **more value** than the perusal of many chapters with no definite purpose in view, and no positive instruction gained.

EVER UNFOLDING

"God intends that to the earnest seeker the **truths** of His Word shall be ever unfolding. While "the secret things belong unto the Lord our God", "those things that are revealed belong unto us and our children". The idea that certain portions of the Bible can **not** be understood has led to neglect of some of its most important truths. The fact needs to be emphasized, and often repeated, that the mysteries of the Bible are not such because God has sought to conceal truth, but because our own weakness or ignorance makes us incapable of comprehending or appropriating truth. The limitation is not in its purpose, but in our capacity. Of those very portions of scripture so often passed by as **impossible** to be understood, **God desires us to understand** as much as our minds are capable of receiving."

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God" that we may be "thoroughly furnished unto all good works".
